Every 6 months there will be new faces within the practice. Dr Murray and Dr Macmillan are now both training GPs.

CQC

CQC are a government organisation assessing for standards of care who are more recently visiting surgeries to undertake inspections. The Village Surgery had a visit in November 2013 giving 2 weeks notice. The CQC had a full day in the surgery inspecting and talking to patients, staff and David Shannon. The Village Surgery failed on infection control at this point. The CQC revisited in February and we passed the final inspection after making a few adjustments and improvements. The CQC inspection takes place every 2 years and the report will be placed on the surgery website for patients to view.

The Village Prescription Service

The Village Prescription is a joint venture with Pharmacy 2U, the biggest online pharmacy in the country. Patients register with service and Pharmacy 2U liaise with The Village Surgery re clinical records. Once the patients script is authorised then the

medication is sent out to a home or work address of your choice. This service is fantastic for patients who work or can not get up to the surgery to collect their prescriptions. The service can also send you a reminder when your medication is due. We have around 4000 patients who are on repeat medication in the surgery, there has been 110 patients signed up to the service in 3 weeks.

Challenge Fund

The Government want to try and encourage GPs to be open longer; Monday to Friday and weekends from 8.00am until 8.00pm. All practices have been invited to place a bit, the Village Surgery are the only practice who have put a bid in in Northumberland. Ware hoping to hear by the end of March or next month if we have won the bid. If we are successful we will employ more GPs and admin staff to accommodate this.

Care.data

This is a service where patients can sign up not to have data shared. Patients must give consent via the practice via an opt in/out service or data will not be shared. The Care data scheme has been cut for the meantime.

Patient Feedback

Majority of patients are extremely satisfied with the overall service of the practice. Results will be displayed in waiting area and the surgery website.

Any other business

Discussed the waiting queue for getting through on the telephone – this will be discussed at the next reception meeting on 10^{th} March 2014.
